"Knowing that <u>everything had now been finished</u>, and so that Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips. WHAT DID JESUS ACCOMPLISH ON THE CROSS?

1. <u>HE SATISFIED THE LAW</u>

"The law of Moses <u>could not save us</u>, because of our sinful nature. But God put into effect a different plan to save us. He sent his own Son in a human body like ours, except that ours are sinful. God destroyed sin's control over us by giving his Son as a sacrifice for our sins. He did this <u>so that the requirement of the law</u> <u>would be fully accomplished</u> for us who no longer follow our sinful nature but instead follow the Spirit." Romans 8:3-4 (NLT)

"He <u>canceled the record</u> that contained the <u>charges against us</u>. <i>He took it and destroyed it by nailing it to Christ's cross." Colossians 2:14 (NLT)

"Christ ended the law so that everyone who believes in him may be right with God" Romans 10:4 (NCV)

2. <u>HE PAID MY PENALTY</u>

"God's Son <u>paid the price</u> to free us, which means that our sins are forgiven." Colossians 1:14 (GW)

"He sacrificed for their sins <u>once for all</u> when he offered himself." Hebrews 7:27 (NIV)

"Now that sins have been forgiven, there is no need to offer any more sacrifices." Hebrews 10:18 (NLT)

3. <u>HE CONQUERED SIN AND DEATH</u>

"The sin of one man, Adam, caused death to rule over us. But all who receive God's wonderful, gracious gift of righteousness will live in <u>triumph over sin and death</u> through this one man, Jesus Christ." Romans 5:17 (NLT)

"When Christ died, he died to <u>defeat the power of sin</u> one time – enough for all time." Romans 6:10 (NCV)

"Jesus became flesh and blood by being born in human form. For only as a human being could he die, and only by dying could he <u>break the power of the devil</u>, who had the <u>power of death</u>. Only in this way could he deliver those who have lived all their lives as slaves to the fear of dying." Hebrews 2:14-15 (NLT)

4. <u>HE DEFEATED THE DEVIL</u>

"God took away Satan's power to accuse you of sin, and He openly <u>triumph at the cross</u> where your sins were all taken away." *displayed to the whole world <u>Christ's</u>* Colossians 2:15 (LB)

"God has <u>freed us from the power of darkness</u>, and brought us into the <u>kingdom</u> of His dear Son." Colossians 1:13 (NCV)

"O our God ...we are powerless against this mighty army that is about to attack us. We do not know what to do, but we are looking to you for <u>help</u>." 2 Chronicles 20:12 (NLT)

"Saving is all His idea and all His work. All we do is trust him enough to let him do it. It's God's gift from start to finish." Ephesians 2:8-9 (MSG)
